elcome to the Yuet Ming Auditorium. Today we are proud to present Hong Kong Shax Theatre Group's adaptation of The Taming of the Shrew, one of William Shakespeare's first comedies. We hope that you will find our take refreshing, with the excitement and vibrancy of the 1980s.

As a theatre group, we are soon to reach a milestone - our 10th anniversary will be in 2020. From our humble beginnings as a small group of 5 in 2010, we have staged plays in original Shakespearean language every year for almost a decade. In 2018, we started staging Shakespeare's plays in Cantonese. These include the Comedy of Errors and The Merchant of Venice, which were both met with great acclaim.

Over the years, we have expanded as a group, now having members spanning generations and cultures and ethnicities, all focused on putting up first-rate plays to entice Hong Kong. Our group has seen 10 generations of Shaxbies as of 2019, with some old Shaxbies involved in the fields of medicine, education and law, and some newer Shaxbies at the primary and secondary levels of education.

As Shax continues to grow, we have also noticed that our audience grows with us. In the coming year, we hope to reunite as many old Shaxbies as possible to celebrate our 10th anniversary in the face of hectic schedules and prior commitments. We hope you look forward to our performance tonight and we look forward to welcoming you again to another Shax production. If you do wish to watch another Shax production, we hope you will join our celebration next year.

ROSALIND WONG

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR/ CO-DIRECTOR

Rosalind, the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education and the Master of Literature and Cultural Studies, is a lecturer. With the role "Rosalind" she won the Best Actress Award in the 2011 Chinese Universities Shakespeare Festival. Since founding Hong Kong Shax Theatre Group in 2010, Rosalind has directed Shakespearean classic plays such as Hamlet, As You Like It, Twelfth Night and A Midsummer Night's Dream. She is the first Chinese to win the Best Director Award at the Hecklers with The Two Gentlemen of Verona in 2016, winning again in 2017 with Love's Labour's Lost. After last year's The Comedy of Errors and Macbeth, Rosalind took on a Cantonese adaptation of The Merchant of Venice, which is her most recent production.





fter producing the cataclysmic tale of Macbeth and the conniving conspiracies of The Merchant of Venice in 2018, we decided to set our hearts on a more light-hearted and fun project for a change. We believe that the Shakespeare classic The Taming of the Shrew contains many merry and jolly elements that both our audience and ourselves can enjoy in the long run. Yet, it is also a play that enables us to retain the severity and intensity found in its message.

With social issues such as gender equality becoming a mainstream topic, The Taming of the Shrew explores gender roles and their relation to power and social status - issues that still exist today despite the play's conception during the Elizabethan era. Despite the connotations the title and the ending carry, we believe that The Taming of the Shrew is a play that can provoke a re-evaluation of today's social conventions and how they have evolved, devolved or remained in their original states.

Anyone who is familiar with the original The Taming of the Shrew must know of the divisive interpretations it presents. However, our production team has worked hard to carve a completely separate lane while retaining as much of the original text to remain faithful to the literature. We have endeavoured to morph its interpretation through characterisation, line delivery and setting to establish a love story of a... different sort. This meticulous process has been a challenge which, we think, has paid off. We hope you enjoy our new take on Shakespeare's work, as farce, hidden truths, and love unravel into this classic comedy.

SIMON SHARMA

CO-DIRECTOR / PRODUCER



Following HKSTG's *The Merchant of Venice*, Ujjwal Sharma (Simon for your convenience) returns to HKSTG in his directorial debut. In 2018, he produced *Macbeth*, and the Cantonese *The Comedy of Errors*. He has also acted with Shax since 2016, in productions such as *The Two Gentlemen of Verona* (2016) and *Love's Labour's Lost* (2017), which won him the Best Supporting Actor at the 2017 Hecklers. He has also worked outside Shax. He played Andrew Aguecheek in *Twelfth Night* (2016) - by the Absolutely Fabulous Theatre Connection (AFTEC) in association with artists from the Royal Shakespeare Company's (RSC) Education Team - and was part of the ensemble in the Youth Arts Foundation's *Flood* (2018). 
PRODUCTION MANAGER


CHRISTOPHER SLY/ NATHANIEL


PLAYER 3/ TAILOR


EMILIA MINOLA / PROPS & SETS HEAD


BIANCA MINOLA

SYNOPSIS




